- Data validation including data formats and required fields (i.e. date formats, SSNs, phone number formats, etc.)
- Accessibility for Section 508 and WCAG 2.1 compliance so forms can be completed using Assistive Technologies.
- Use PDF fields and annotations for dynamic graphics displays such as line/bar graphs, flow charts, and dynamic tables.

Types of PDF Forms: AcroForms and XFA Forms

There are two distinct types of PDF Forms. Forms created with Adobe Acrobat are AcroForms. Forms created with Adobe Form Designer are XFA forms. Appligent's Services Team is proficient in both technologies and more importantly, can help you decide which is right for you.

AcroForms

AcroForms are static, fillable and retain all of the elements of traditional PDF. They can be created and edited by several software applications, including InDesign and Adobe Acrobat. These forms can be manipulated using all of the editing capabilities of Acrobat and will function as a normal PDF file in batch or server processes intended for PDF. AcroForms are widely supported and are the most commonly used type of PDF forms.

XFA Forms

XFA forms are XML based and can only be created and edited in Adobe LiveCycle Designer. This format is useful for implementations that require a form to expand to accommodate more data, for example, expand from 2 to 6 fields if needed to add names and ages of children in a household. XFA forms are based on the XML Forms Architecture and therefore some of the features of standard PDF are not available.
